Hi Emma,

Good to chat to you earlier, please see below track plan for the Coppice car park. We have sought to use this car park as it meets all of the requirements for the site, below.

To reiterate some of the point from when we spoke;

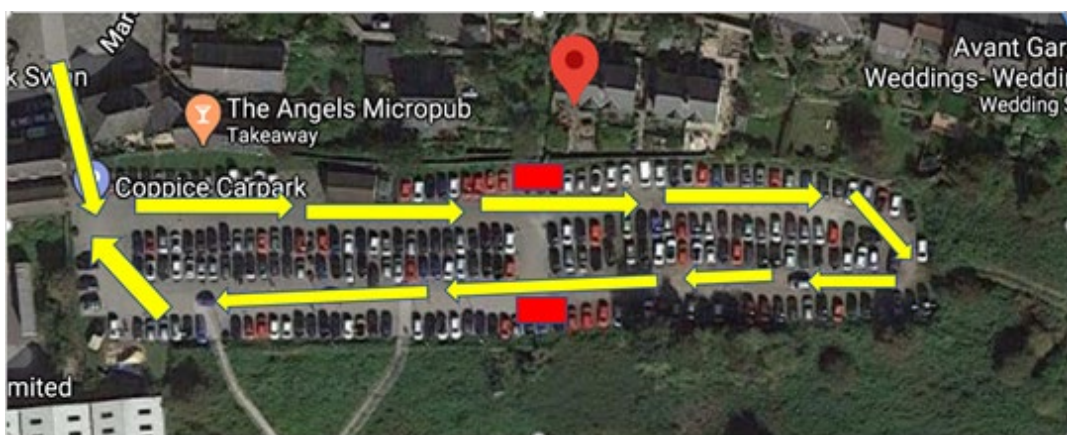
- A key consideration for the placement of the MTU is that it does not impede the highway, especially a main road. DCC highways have taken a look at the site and believe this is a feasible option.
- The site must be able to hold up to 40 cars at any one time and may have to manage around 80 cars per hour.
- It needs to be a hard standing area and accessible to vehicles above 2.8m tall (or with the ability to open a barrier to allow access to the site).
- It must be accessible to residents- too far out of town and this becomes difficult.

The site would typically be occupied for 3-4 days at a time. Serco attend the site at around 9.45am each day ready to commence testing at 10.30am they will finish testing at 3.30pm. Nothing will be left on site each day.

We will give as much notice as possible when choosing when to place a MTU site, generally between 2 weeks and a month. However this may be shorter should we identify an outbreak locally and we need to rapidly deploy this resource.

If any councillors have any questions regarding the use of the site I would happily answer them.
